



2019 ASHRAE Winter Conference Travel Grants
January 12-16, Atlanta, GA

The Golden Gate Chapter would like to invite Chapter Students to apply for a travel grant of up to **\$1,250** to be applied to expenses for the 2019 ASHRAE Winter Conference in Atlanta, GA. Two travel grants will be awarded.

Each January, the American Society of Heating, Refrigeration, and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE) hosts a Winter Conference and AHR Expo. The conference is attended by over 10,000 industry professionals. Attendees can discuss the latest topics in the building industry; participate in technical tours; attend ASHRAE Learning Institute courses; earn professional credits; and obtain ASHRAE certifications.

As an applicant, you are required to:

- Be an ASHRAE Student member (apply online)
- Be a full-time student at the time of the conference
- Not be a previous recipient of a Golden Gate ASHRAE Chapter conference travel grant
- Attend at least five sessions and one student program event at the conference.
- Write an article for the Fog Dispenser on your conference experience (½ page to 1 page in length).
- Present for five minutes at a Golden Gate ASHRAE Chapter meeting about your conference experience

***Note:** Preference will be given to applicants enrolled in colleges or universities that fall within the geographical territory covered by the Golden Gate Chapter, which includes the following counties: Del Norte, Humboldt, Mendocino, Lake, Sonoma, Napa, Solano, Marin, Contra Costa, San Francisco, Alameda (except for Livermore), and San Mateo.*

The Details

The following costs associated with attending the 2019 Winter Conference in Atlanta will be covered by Golden Gate ASHRAE Chapter – up to a total of \$1,250:

- Airfare, or a cheaper forms of transportation from the departure point of the grant recipient(s), to the Conference
- Ground transportation to and from airports (maximum \$60 total)
- Lodging
- Meals (up to \$60 per day - \$15/\$20/\$25 for breakfast/lunch/dinner)
- Registration for the conference and social events

Expenses that will not be reimbursed include:

- Car rentals
- Tolls
- Parking fees

The grant recipient(s) will be responsible for paying for all costs incurred due to conference, including – but not limited to – the airfare, lodging, and registration. After the conference, an expense report and associated receipts shall be submitted to the Student Activities Scholarships & Grants Lead for review and reimbursement by each grant recipient.

The Student Program has the following specific activities for the student attendee(s). Please plan on attending one, at a minimum:

- Student Orientation and Welcome
- Student/YEA Mixer
- Student Program
- Student Tour of the Georgia Institute of Technology – Kendeda Building for Innovative Sustainable Design (\$25 per person – sign up separately)
